

**Mississippi LPN Association
Student Nurses Organization
Dress Code
Adopted September 9, 2010
Revised April 10, 2014**

Members of the Mississippi LPN Association Student Nurses Organization are expected to dress and groom in a manner that promotes a positive image of the LPN profession. MLPNA SNO members should dress in a conservative manner that is professional and businesslike. The standard dress at MLPNA SNO members is business attire. To promote the professional development of the student nurse the following dress code has been established for attending meetings of the Mississippi LPN Association:

- Business attire is described as a minimum of:
- Dress slacks, skirts, dresses, or suits
- Dress shirts/sport shirts with collars for men
- Shoes appropriate for professional dress (includes dress sandals for females)
- Some occasions or competitions require a more formal appearance and may require a tie, sports coat, or suit.
- Dresses and skirts should be one inch above knee or longer length.

It is the responsibility of the PN Faculty to ensure the appropriate dress is worn. It is the responsibility of the PN Faculty to counsel the individual if an apparent lapse in observation of the dress code occurs.

The following attire is **not** considered appropriate for MLPNA SNO Members:

- Jeans, shorts, athletic wear.
- Pajamas or sleepwear.
- T-shirts worn as outerwear
- Beach sandals, flip-flops, sneakers, bedroom shoes
- Suggestive, revealing clothing
- Visible tattoos, body art or piercings

Friday is business casual day. Casual attire is allowed.

- May wear blue jeans that have no holes, frays. Jeans may not be low rise cut and should be of loose fit.
- Capri length is allowed
- May wear clean tennis shoes, sneakers or sandals. Flip flops, bedroom shoes, or beach sandals are not allowed
- School, LPN t-shirt or convention t-shirts are allowed. T-shirts with other logos are not allowed.
